

TROOP 17 SCHOLARSHIP

The RCMP's "Troop 17 Scholarship", named in honour of the Force's first female regular members, recognizes outstanding work in the area of anti-harassment and the promotion of anti-harassment principles.

The Troop 17 Scholarship will be awarded yearly to deserving full-time college or university students to recognize their anti-harassment efforts in their schools and/or communities. An annual fund of up to \$5,000 will be used to fund the award a maximum of three (3) scholarships per year, ranging in value from \$500 to \$2,500.

Applicants wishing to be considered for the Troop 17 Scholarship will be required to submit a 1500-word letter outlining their anti-harassment efforts, as well as two supporting community or academic references. They will also be required to submit proof of enrollment in an accredited, full-time Canadian college or university program. Annual deadlines, as well as a description of the award, will be published on the RCMP's website.

Applications will be reviewed by the National Anti-Harassment Advisory Committee, the recommendations of which will be forwarded to the RCMP Commissioner for approval.
